The keynote speaker for the UAPB 2011 Military Ball will be one of our own, Major (Ret) James Parker, a member of the Class of 1981. MR. PARKER recently retired as Associate Director of Organizational Readiness and Strategy, Internal Revenue Service. Parker enrolled as a freshman and ROTC Military Science Cadet at UAPB in 1979. In December 1981, Parker graduated Cum Laude with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration, and was commissioned as a Regular Army Second Lieutenant of Medical Services. Parker commanded a medical company in the 1st Cavalry Division at Fort Hood, Texas, Desert Shield, and Desert Storm; and was a Platoon Leader in Fulda, Germany. His principal staff assignments have been Chief Medical Logistics, Medical Logistics Officers, and Assistant s-4. His last active duty position was Commander of the 131st Field Hospital.



He has received twenty military awards and decorations, holds a Masters of Business Administration from American University at Washington DC, and is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

A Celebration of Life...

Col (Ret) Albert Russell Spaulding Jr. attended Hampton Institute in Hampton, VA earning a B.A. in Building Construction and Civil Engineering in 1958. Upon graduation Albert was commissioned as a 1LT in the United States Army.

He was sent to Lawton, Oklahoma for field artillery training and Met Virginia Horn. Virginia and Albert were married on April 24, 1959. Their union produced three daughters, Hazel Michelle, Sheila Marquette, and Alicia Nicole. During his military career Albert traveled extensively and served as a field artillery officer during the Vietnam War. Albert received numerous medals and military honors among these the Legion of Merit and the Bronze Star. Albert was assistant PMS at UAPB from 1968-1970.

After retiring from the military Albert and Virginia founded Automation Research Systems, Limited (ARS) in 1983. ARS, Ltd. was a thriving and successful business. And despite the demand of his successful business career, Albert always took time to support local and national organizations that



focused on improving the plight of other minorities and the underprivileged.

He died November 20. 2010 at the age of 75.

She assessed in September, Active Duty, Military Intelligence (her 1st Choice), DMG—awesome!

Provided the 1st (there is that word again, no way to confirm or deny—unless you know the answer) all female color at the Chancellor's Spring Convocation Ceremony. That went off very well. Speaking of females, currently 1/3 of the battalion is now female.
